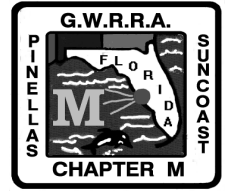

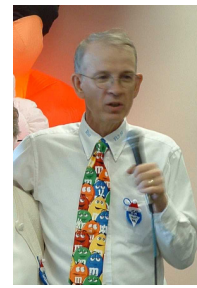

## **Preparedness**

**How many of us are every truly prepared? The weather is going to be cooler soon and this will be prime riding time for many of our members. So we thought this would be a good time to talk about what to do before the ride. Many time we have talked about preparing our bikes (remember T-clock) and ourselves for a ride. It is very important that we are in the proper frame of mind to go for a ride and equally important to be well rested. It also helps if you do some simple stretching exercises prior to ride in order to have your body prepared also. We are asking a lot from ourselves to maneuver a 800 – 1,000 or more motorcycle around. You will never see a top amateur or professional athlete begin a contest without stretching. This can definitely help prevent strained muscles.**

**Knowing where the ride is going and anticipated arrival time will allow you to eat prior to ride if no food stops are planned. If food stops are planned, then you need to be sure that you will be able to not start chewing on you clothing for sustenance before we arrive at the restaurant.**

**The not so obvious items to think about for the ride is the need to be prepared is something bad were to happen. We should all carry a first aid kit on our bikes and a small fire extinguisher could be very useful. Most everyone in the chapter has kept current in both their first aid and CPR. We are very lucky within FL to be able to take these courses through our Rider Education program and the cost to us is nothing.**

**You should also carry a type of hazard warning device can also be useful if you have a mechanical problem and are stuck along side the road. These can be some type of strobe light or even some of the reflective triangles. It is import for us to be seen if the bike is parked.**

**The next item we should consider is emergency cards that are CURRENT. These should be kept in the left fairing pocket of our bikes (this cannot be locked as the other pockets and bags can be) and all GWRRA members expect to find them there. The one thing that should definitely be with you is emergency contact information. This can be on the emergency card and many of us have programmed this into our cell phones. The listing that medical and police will look for is a listing called ICE (In Case of Emergency). The current recommendation is not to list ICE and someone's name, but to put ICE Wife, Husband, Son, Daughter, or any one else you trust. In my phone I listed ICE Son 1 and ICE Son 2. Hopefully none of you need to list ICE Wife 1, 2, or more.**

**Another item that the chapter is starting is emergency information that you provide to the chapter. These will be compiled into notebook and certain individuals within the chapter will carry these with them. This way all that will be required is for that person to access the information and then provide it to the emergency people. It will require you to make sure that the chapter is informed whenever there is a significant change in your health.**

**Remember preparing properly for the ride can increase you enjoyment and those others around you. It could also help you in case of a medical emergency.**
